THE STORY

Water for Elephants is told through the lens of an older Jacob Jankowski, nearly six decades removed from the most transformative chapter of his life. Now feeling invisible in the quiet routine of assisted living, Jacob reflects on the season that shaped him most profoundly. As memory carries him backward, the

audience is transported to the height of the Great Depression, when a devastating tragedy upended Jacob's future and sent him leaping onto a passing train — the train of the Benzini Brothers circus.

Young Jacob, once a promising veterinary student, finds himself immersed in a traveling world of spectacle and survival. The circus dazzles audiences with breathtaking performances, but behind the glitter lies instability and danger. Struggling financially and held together by grit more than security, the company is led

by the charismatic yet volatile August, whose authority casts a long shadow over performers and animals alike. Jacob is hired as the circus veterinarian, caring for creatures who are as vulnerable as the people who tend them.

As Jacob grows closer to Marlena, the circus's equestrian star, and bonds with Rosie, an elephant deemed untrainable, he begins to confront the moral compromises of this fragile world. Trust is hard-won and easily shattered. Loyalties are tested. Love becomes both a risk and a refuge. In the tension between cruelty and

compassion, Jacob must decide what kind of man he will become.

Looking back across the decades, the older Jacob recognizes that the circus — chaotic, troubled, and fleeting — was also where he discovered belonging, courage, and resilience. What once felt like instability becomes, in hindsight, the place he truly came alive. Water for Elephants is ultimately a story about memory, identity, and the enduring power of connection — reminding us that home is not a place we inherit, but one we build together.



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

A couple of years ago I turned 50 and it hit me harder than I thought it would.

Most of us eventually hit a milestone that prompts us to look backward. When we look back, we certainly see our achievements, but more often, we find ourselves dwelling on the chaotic, uncertain, or painful seasons in our lives—the times that pushed us to our limits and left us asking: *Why did that season shape me the way it did?*

Water for Elephants lives inside that question.

When Mr. Jankowski looks back on his time with Benzini Brothers circus, he remembers instability, danger, and loss. However, it was then—in the most uncertain chapter of his life—that he discovered who he truly was.

Over the past few weeks I have found myself reflecting on themes from the story, and have tried to talk about them with my students at each rehearsal. Specifically, that: *belonging is built; trust is delicate but necessary; and resilience grows in community.*

Tonight, I invite you to consider: Where in your life have you mistaken chaos for failure, only to later discover it was transformation? Within the uncertainty of life, may we all choose to build belonging, trust in those around us, and create a community that can endure.
